Since Easter the Church has been celebrating the mysteries of our faith at each of the Sunday liturgies. On the fiftieth day we celebrated PENTECOST and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Each and every one of us has been given a commission to GO OUT TO THE NATIONS AND MAKE DESCIPLES OF ALL PEOPLE. The very next week we celebrated the FEAST OF THE HOLY TRINITY. We believe in ONE God in THREE persons. Many though we are, we are all one called to use our gifts to build up the Church.

Each of us is called to reverance the past, live in the present, and plan for the future. On the 18th of June the Church celebrated the FEAST OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST. (Spiritual works)-Admonish the sinner, instruct the ignorant, counsel the doubtful, comfort the sorrowful, bear wrongs patiently, forgive all injuries and pray for the living and the dead.

During the summer months perhaps we all can take some time to reflect on how well we reflect the love of Christ in our lives.

My Walk With God

Like many in this congregation, my walk with God has been one of great blessings. One in particular helped me broaden my horizons, and provided tools for a lifelong spiritual journey.

I'm not proud to say it, but in high school I was effectively a religion class drop-out. My family had switched parishes, and along the way I'd missed the chance to be confirmed with classmates my age. A suggestion was passed along that perhaps the priest at our new parish, John Looby, might be willing to hold special tutoring sessions to get me back on track. I asked if he had the time to spare and as it turned out, he was willing. So every Sunday night, I'd meet Father Looby at the rectory of St. Joseph's Church in Dannemora, NY for lessons. That's where I began to broaden and deepen my understanding of the Church, and gained a lifelong friend in the process.

Lessons from Father Looby, or "Padre" as I like to call him, covered the fundamentals of Catholicism found in the standard faith formation textbook, but that only scratched the surface. If the sacrament of confirmation is meant to provide a young Christian soldier with the tools to develop a mature faith, then my time with Father Looby left me well armed intellectually, and widened my gaze to topics I'd never considered.

It turned out, both the Padre and I had an appreciation of Monty Python, and as it happens the guys in Monty Python had an appreciation of philosophy. That led us to explore that subject, the nature of knowledge and the study of the search for meaning, everything from Plato's Cave to questions of Determinism and Free Will. A student of history, archeology and language, the Padre explained how the books of the Bible were first recorded then translated to the texts we know today. We read publications like *America Magazine* and Catholic writers like James Martin, all of which taught me Catholicism is not an antiquated faith, chiseled in stone and frozen in time, but rather a vibrant faith with many contemporary Catholic scholars fully engaged in exploring the most difficult questions of the day. The study of Catholicism *is* the study of history, language, philosophy and much more. The topics we explored were not secular, but were in fact tied directly to the underpinnings of much of our Catholic faith.

Father Looby is retired now in much the same way as Father Jack. Which is to say, he's still saying multiple masses every weekend at parishes in the Ogdensburg Diocese. We still stay in touch - he visited us in Burnt Hills earlier this spring - and we exchange links to noteworthy articles about scientific breakthroughs or archeological discoveries (like any good teacher, he never stops learning). Among the traditional gifts bestowed by the Holy Spirit at confirmation are wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, fortitude, piety, and wonder and awe in God's presence. The Padre gave me lessons in all of these virtues, as well as patience and compassion. My walk with God has been filled with good fortune. I am so fortunate indeed to have met Father Looby. Has someone made a difference in your life?

PASTORAL VISITATION TRAINING OPPORTUNITY!

If you believe God calls you to serve our church as a parish pastoral visitation minister this message is for you! The next training will be at St. John the Evangelist, Schenectady. Topics include: the art of pastoral visitation, communication skills, illness issues, grief and loss, suffering and dying, and the use of prayer and sacraments in pastoral ministry. Sessions will be from 6:00-8:00pm Wednesday evenings – October 4, 11, 18, 25 and November 1, 8, 2017. The cost for the training is \$40 and covers the sessions and all materials. 

The Nurse's Corner

Tick borne diseases! Yuk!

So, you think that Lyme disease is the only tick-borne disease to worry about this summer? Lyme disease is prevalent in upstate New York, but there are some other diseases or disorders caused by infected ticks about which you need to be aware. The National Institute for Occupational Safety & Health (NIOSH) lists other tick borne diseases:

Babesiosis Ehrlichiosis Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever Southern Tick-Associated Rash

Illness

Tick-Borne Relapsing Fever Tularimia Anaplasmosis Colorado Tick Fever Powassan Encephalitis Q Fever.

Each of these diseases are caused by a pathogen or organism passed to humans by an infected tick bite.

- Ticks are found in ALL states except for Hawaii.
- Ticks can be infected by bacteria, viruses or parasites.
- Ticks cannot fly or jump- you brush up on ticks in vegetation or high grass.

To keep you and your family safe this summer keep in mind the flowing tips:

Use tick repellent with DEET (on clothes only –not on skin)

Wear light-colored long pants and shirts when hiking.

Shower after working outside to check for and wash off ticks.

Remove ticks with tweezers and keep for identification.
