Prayer and Worship

The administration of the Sacraments and celebration of the Eucharist each weekend are the source and summit of all we are and all we are called to be. We've enjoyed weekly Masses with our Sacramental Minister, Fr. Jack Varno, myself, Fr. Peter Russo, and Deacon Frank Thomas. We have welcomed dozens of new parishioners, baptized 14 new children, administered First Eucharist for 11 students, witnessed 3 marriages, and celebrated 18 funerals. Everyone's use of their Name Tags has been a great resource for building our faith community.

Faith Formation and Youth Ministry

We strive to provide a stimulating and joyful environment in which to teach the values, heritage and traditions of the Catholic Church. Within this educational framework, we try to guide our youth to become lifelong witness to the reality of the Risen Christ through the Sacramental life, personal and communal celebrations and charitable works.

During the school year, we served 149 students. Our programs, assisted by your much-needed volunteer services, are under the direction of Roberta Quinn, and Grace Fay. Some of their programs last year were Children's Stations of the Cross, Retreat day for Reconciliation, Retreat day for First Communion, Breakfast with Santa. Youth Ministry held a number of workshops covering a number of topics including: discipleship, mental health, and faith in Africa, just to name a few. We had students involved in a number of service projects both within the community and beyond. We held 6 separate retreats for our young people, along with our monthly "Open Door Thursday." We had one student attend the Christian Leadership Institute and one of our Young People attended the St. George Trek in New Mexico. We look forward to the coming year and all it will bring. We have young people attending the Diocesan Middle School Youth Rally and the National Catholic Youth Conference. Keep your eyes open for more updates on Youth Ministry as the year progresses.

- *Contact information- next of kin with addresses, phone numbers (home + cell); religious affiliation, with contact information (if pertinent).
- *Address/phone number of the closest American Red Cross-33 Everett Road, Albany, NY 12206. 1-800-RED-CROSS
- *Name and location of the closest Police Department
- *Names and phone numbers of your health care providers
- *Copies of Medicare/Medicaid, other health insurance, Pacemaker/ defibrillator cards
- *Personal and spouse/family health histories
- *Living will or advance directives/health care proxy
- *List of current medications/local pharmacy address and phone number
- *Eye glass prescription (extra pair of glasses) and hearing aid batteries
- * Pet information- food/medications and local shelter address and number
- *A smile!

Keep information in a loose-leaf binder with plastic sleeves for documents and flash drive.

High Adventure with God and My Fellow Scouts

I am Aleksandr Lorenc and I had the tremendous opportunity to go to Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico in July. I was one of two Catholic Boy Scouts from our Diocese who were chosen to participate in the St. George Trek at Philmont.

The Saint George Trek is The National Catholic Committee on Scouting's® high adventure leadership program for older Boy Scouts and Venture Crew members at Philmont Scout Ranch. To be qualified, Boy Scouts and Venture Crew members must be actively involved in their faith. The program brought Catholic high school youth, male and female, from around the country, together with selected priests, a religious brother and sister, seminarians, and a married woman for eleven days of backpacking through the unchanged lands of Philmont Scout Ranch. The trek put an emphasis on finding our vocation.

We all met up at the Madonna Retreat Center in Albuquerque. There we got our name tags and our polo t-shirts. After we had lunch, we played games on the field next to the Saint Pius X Ben Rios Field. We had our introductions of the people who would be responsible for us over the next couple of weeks. We spent two days at the retreat house and had Mass each night. Crews rotated responsibilities of Mass, prayer services and Adoration. The day before we left to go to Philmont we had talks on crew dynamics, with team-building exercises, how to setup a stove, building a first aid kit and more. The most important was the one on conflict resolution because we had to learn how to deal with people who we just met the day before. We also had a talk on discerning our Vocation while we were on the Trek and after we returned home.

I had great fun exploring the Philmont base camp. There were many things to do while our leaders were getting instructions from the staff. My favorite activities were shopping and branding things. Our first night there we had to sleep in trail tents as opposed to the nice canvas tents because, I heard at the end of the trek, the staff had thought that the St. George Trek was one crew as opposed to eight different crews. While in New Mexico my crew celebrated Mass every day, both on the trek and when we returned to Albuquerque. While on the trek we built our own altars at our campsite. Together we climbed Baldy Mountain, and went over very large and steep hills (aka mesas). At the midway point of our trek, all of the crews met up at Cimarroncito and we celebrated Mass and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament together. It was during Adoration that I clearly heard my calling to a vocation of Holy Orders. I was a little nervous about this calling, as usually I am very shy and quiet, especially around new people. But while before the Blessed Sacrament, I felt courage to do what others in my life have done.

My advice to the young people is find good friends. Not just friends you hang out with but friends that you know will have your back just as you have theirs. If you want to discover your calling surround yourself with good people and spend quiet time before God, just listening to Him. I want to thank everyone, both my family and the OLG parishioners, for all their prayers and support. I also want to thank the Dioceses for sponsoring this incredible opportunity to explore my vocation. I look forward to serving my community in many different ministries in the future.


