This issue of the parish newsletter will go to press during the Easter season when the Church will be reflecting on the great mysteries of our faith each Sunday until Pentecost. Each Sunday during Lent we began the mass with the statement "Blessed is the Kingdom of the Father the son and the Holy Spirit" In my Lenten homilies I spoke often of God's constant invitation to enter into the mystery; the mystery of our personal relationship with God in Jesus Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit.

In the January issue of the liturgical Worship, there was an article by Jette Bendixen Ronkilde that spoke of the importance of the active participation of the congregation in the liturgy as the means of our experiencing the mystery of our "faith journey". #### WOMEN'S SPIRITUAL DAY OF REFLECTION 2017

We had a great gathering last fall to reflect on the subject of "being in the moment". Clare Bradley, presentor, challenged us with questions, discussions, meditation and prayer, guiding us to learn how to bring ourselves into the moment—oneness with the Holy Spirit, presence.

The goal of presence is to calm your mind and connect with God. The "now" is ALL WE HAVE! As we engage in moment living, we are experiencing the sacred, and we become God 's instrument. When we are in the moment we do not need anything, becoming open completely to God. When we step out of the moment, we move back into the past with all its sorrow, heartache, and regrets. However, you cannot change the past....useless worry robs us of our inner peace. Then you may move to the future. Will I get sick? How will I die? How will I pay the bills? You can plan forever, but then you receive the diagnosis and everything is changed. Projecting the future is fear, our greatest spiritual enemy.

So we sit with important questions: Do I make a conscious decision to be in the moment? When I find myself in the past or future, do I take responsibility for abandoning the moment? What is God's will for me at the moment? Do I live in a trance state? Do I bring my body forward, with my mind following it? Or do I do the reverse? If this were the last moment of my life, what would I want to be thinking of?

We hashed out the downside of anxiety and the upside of letting go and letting God! We practiced meditating, feeling all the inner parts of our body, sensitizing ourselves to the voice of the moment. We prayed and shared and laughed when the spirit moved us! We enjoyed community and the opportunity to go back into our busy world, and listen to the voice of the Spirit while holding anxiety at bay.

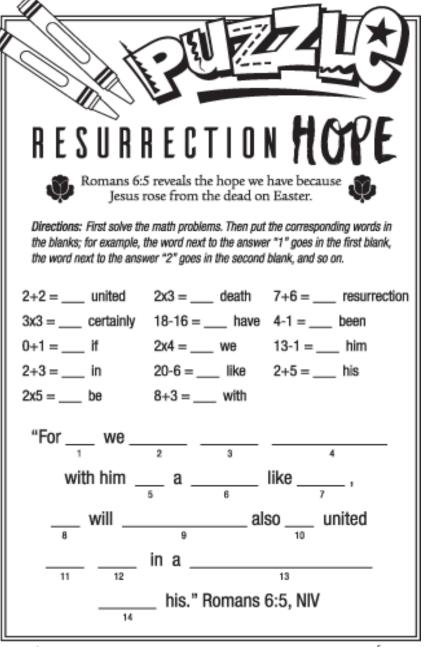
Watch for our fall retreat and join us as we gather, women of faith, to share our journey!

## Nurse's Corner

#### Stroke Awareness & Prevention

A stroke occurs when blood in the brain is interrupted or reduced. This event robs the brain of oxygen and nutrients. A stroke is a medical emergency!

Good news is that fewer people are dying from stroke and more people are treated successfully for stroke in the last 15 years. Prevention is key.

Signs or symptoms to be aware of: **F A S T** 

**F** = **FACE**. Ask a person to smile. Does the face droop?

**A = ARMS**. Ask a person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward? Or is one arm unable to move?

**S = SPEECH**. Ask a person to repeat a simple phrase. Is the speech slurred or sound strange?

**T** = **TIME**. If you observe any of these signs, call 911 immediately!

#### **Risk Factors**

There are many risk factors that can increase your risk of stroke.

**Lifestyle** factors that can be managed or changed are:

Overweight or obese status Physical inactivity Heavy or binge drinking Illicit drug (cocaine/ methamphetamines) use

**Medical** risk factors that can be managed or changed are:

High blood pressure Cigarette smoking High cholesterol Diabetes Obstructive sleep apnea

Cardiovascular disease-heart failure, heart defects, heart infection or abnormal heart rhythm.

**Healthy lifestyle recommendations** for overall cardiac health, including stroke prevention include:

Control high blood pressure

Control cholesterol Quit tobacco use Control diabetes Treat sleep apnea Avoid illicit drugs.

Talk to your health care professional. Follow recommendations. Take medications as prescribed. Prevention of stroke is easier than stroke treatment!!

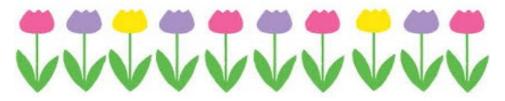
