With this issue of <u>Our Christian Walk</u> we embark on a new journey. Fr. Peter has retired and we wish him well and pray for him in his "new" occupation. The Albany Diocese has announced the Interim Parish Team for Our Lady of Grace and St Joseph's. The Interim Parish team consists of Fr. Jack Varno and Debra Griffith. Debra Griffith has been employed at St Joseph's as the pastoral associate for finance. Fr. Jack will be with us each weekend for Mass and the Sacraments. He may occasionally be with us during the week for Mass or a funeral. Debra Griffith will be at OLG for 1-1.5 days a week to assist with administrative issues and assist in identifying any parish issues where the diocese needs to be more involved. "This team will work with and assist the parish and its parishioners during the time that the parish does not have an appointed pastor or parish life director."

What does this all mean for us? The interim team will not be running the parish. Their role is to work with and assist the parish and its parishioners. The implied message is that we, the parishioners, will need to take more ownership of the parish duties not covered by the clerical staff.

We are in the unique position of making good things happen here at OLG. But it takes your input, your involvement. Do you have any suggestions to make our community more vibrant? Is there anything you would like to see added to our parish life? Do you see a need not being met in our community? Do you have a talent that can be a benefit for OLG? Don't hold back! 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Reigniting Our Faith Campaign launch at Our Lady of Grace

The diocesan-wide fund-raising campaign entitled Reigniting Our Faith has officially started at Our Lady of Grace. A first reception was conducted at Carney's Tavern in Ballston Lake on Saturday evening August 24. More than 20 parishioners joined with Pastor Peter Russo, Deacon Frank Thomas and members of OLG's campaign committee to watch a video led by the Bishop which describes and explains the purpose of the campaign.

The campaign started in the Albany Catholic Diocese back in the summer of 2017 and OLG began forming a committee and generating its Case Statement through 2018 into the Spring of 2019. Our parish will conduct outreach efforts to all members of the parish from now through the month of November. The campaign will run along a parallel path to the pastoral council and trustees' efforts to address and plan for the parish needs following the upcoming retirement of Fr. Peter and the interim period as the diocese determines who the next pastor will be.

Campaign proceeds will be shared between the diocese and our parish on a 30/70 split. Seventy percent of the proceeds will be used to support needed improvements here at OLG in the building and parking lot. It will also be used for programs vital to bolstering OLG's ongoing Faith Formation and Evangelization efforts from our Ballston Lake home. The intent is for OLG to make the kind of improvements to better serve our parishioners now, and also set conditions which can help grow the number of people attending mass and participating in our programs in the future.

The diocese will use 30 percent of the proceeds to help fund future vocations for the priest hood, support the fund for retired priests and support ongoing Catholic education.

The campaign here will be conducted in stages. Initially, mailed invitations are being *sent to groups of parishioners for receptions to be held immediately following* masses at OLG. This will enable the committee to make in person presentations in an organized way over a period of several weeks. In this way, parishioners will be able to hear details for themselves and then ask questions. Before the fall is over, it is hoped that every parishioner will come to know and understand the importance of the campaign and have the chance to participate. Stay tuned for more information in weekly bulletins.



Update from OLG Pastoral Council

The OLG pastoral council met in June and August. There was no meeting in July. However, OLG trustees John Lorenc and Polly Van Nostrand and I attended a meeting at the Diocese Pastoral Planning in late June to learn about the planning process underway for identifying a successor to our pastor Fr. Peter Russo and conditions affecting our parish and others.

Following the approval of Fr. Peter's retirement in late September, council representatives were invited to meet with Deacon Frank Berning where we learned that a transition period would begin on October 1 and could last for months. In July we shared what we learned with other members of the council.

As was reported in the previous issue of this newsletter, we learned that due to the shortage of priests and the recent retirement of others, the diocese must assign an interim priest and an interim administrator to perform the normal functions of a pastor. In this way, OLG will to continue to function, with changes, and more of the responsibilities of running the parish in the future will be borne by the parishioners.

We have learned from the Diocese that the interim priest and administrator are Fr. Jack Varno and Debra Griffith. "This team will work with and assist the parish and its parishioners during the time that the parish does not have an appointed pastor or parish life director."

At the August pastoral council meeting, the available information on the transition plans was discussed. I presented an update on the launch of the Reigniting Our Faith Campaign at OLG. We received a Youth Ministry update from Grace Fay and a financial report for the end of our fiscal year. As was reported in the last newsletter, OLG is experiencing reduced numbers at Mass and the weekly offertory collections have declined. To help the parish secure a reserve, the old rectory has been placed on the market for sale. This effort is underway.

The council is focused on the future. We need to support the transition process, work productively through the interim period and complete the Reigniting Our Faith Campaign before the end of the fall. Proceeds gained through the campaign will enable the parish over time to make essential improvements to our building, our ministry programs and establish a deliberate outreach effort to grow parish life.

There is much to do. Please stay tuned.

Your home is castle. It's your safe-haven. Yet it can be a place where accidents happen. Accidents are the fifth cause of death in the US. To be safe here are some safety pointers:

HOME

Install smoke/carbon monoxide detectors

Lower hot water heater to safe temperature level $<\!\!120F$

Secure or remove scatter rugs

Post all emergency numbers available or program into your phone

Have a fire escape plan from bedrooms and homepractice it

Use a sturdy step stool for climbing or use grab tool

BATHROOM

Use nonskid mats in tubs/shower Store meds in dry, cool place Dispose old meds Use bedside commode at night Install orange bulb in night light fixture for night

EXTERIOR

Keep walkways clear of debris and obstructions Install lights in walkways and driveways Keep strong hand rails secure near stairs Keep doors locked while in and out of home
